Only about 1/3 of the accepted/submitted papers had female first author (anonymous reviewing)

  - Short papers
    - On-going research
  - Demonstrations

---

- Student sessions
  - why
  - Mentoring: student workshop with later deadline, comments from the senior members
  - Students involved in organisation
  - NEALT student fellowships to funding travelling

# Recommendations for NODALIDA 2011

---

- Nordic vs. international
  - Sense of community, contacts
  - Geographical area – not a constraint
    - What about Poland, Northern Germany?
  - Let grow organically
  - No particular “relevance to Nordic” -criteria
  - International review committee →  
International review standards
